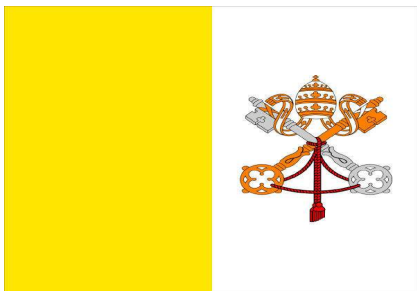

Via Crucis

The Carrera marble Stations of the Cross that have been donated to the parish by Stephen F. Stumpf were created by Joseph Sibbel (1850-1907).

"Joseph Sibbel may not be a household name in mainstream art circles, but he rose to become one of the most popular and influential sculptors of ecclesiastical sculpture. A German-born artist who emigrated to the United States settling in Cincinnati, Ohio, in 1873, he joined several other artists from the same workshop, who had established an atelier for ecclesiastical sculpture....

"He insisted that his plasters be destroyed so that no two works would ever be the same, hence the subtle variations that are evident in narrative subjects that recount the same story as in the Stations of the Cross cycle of which there are other known, but slightly different, versions....

"Arguably his most important commission was creating numerous sculptures for St Patrick's Cathedral in New York. Most often Sibbel's Stations of the Cross plaques were carved from plaster, but he did execute a handful in marble."

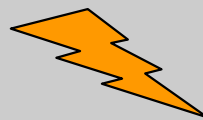

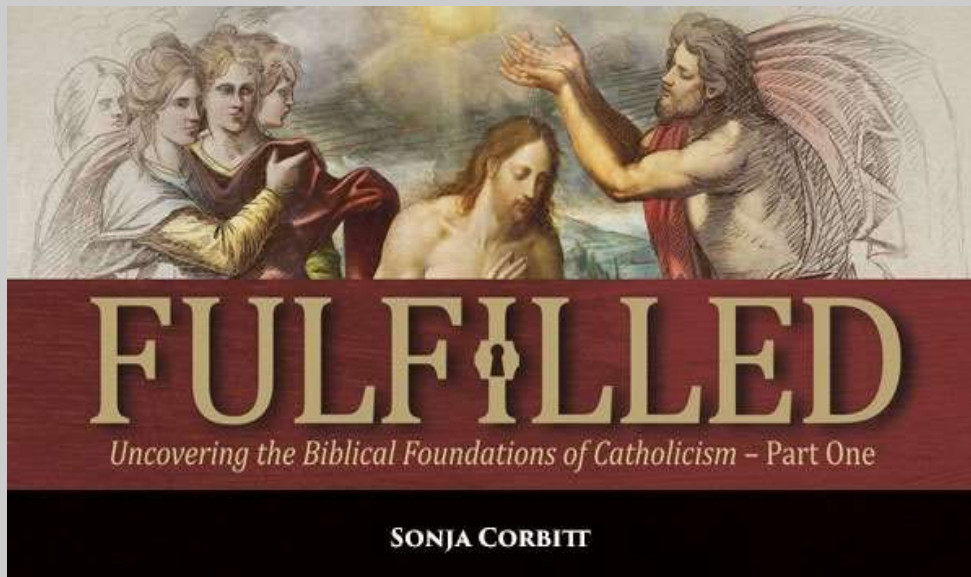

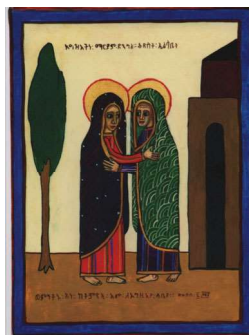
